The Age of Tiffany: Between Nouveau and Deco On View April 21 – July 22, 2018

Huntington, NY – Louis Comfort Tiffany's vases, lamps and a stunning stained-glass window light up the gallery in Heckscher Museum of Art's exhibition *The Age of Tiffany: Between Nouveau and Deco.* Tiffany led a revolution in the decorative arts at the turn of the 20th Century. This exhibition places the master with other decorative art from the Museum's Permanent Collection. *On view April 21 to July 22, 2018*

In addition to Tiffany Studio glasswork, the exhibition includes sculptures, textiles, and furniture from other renowned artists of the era, including Edward Berge, Enid Bell, and Max Kuehne. "The 'ideal' underlying the decorative work of this period was that beautiful utilitarian objects enrich the lives of those who behold them," said Lisa Chalif, Curator, Heckscher Museum of Art.

Primarily known for his glass and decorative work, Louis Comfort Tiffany was trained in oil and watercolor, but in 1879, he turned to interior decoration. Tiffany patented a process for manufacturing iridescent Favrile glass and produced the vases, lamps, and windows for which he is best known.

Lindsy R. Parrott, Executive Director and Curator of the Neustadt Collection of Tiffany Glass will explore the history of Tiffany glass -- and the artist's considerable influence on American decorative art -- at a Gallery Talk on June 7, 2018, 7 to 8:30 pm.

Surface Tension: Pictorial Space in 20th-Century Art

Since the beginning of the 20th century, artistic handling of the picture plane has shifted dramatically. *Surface Tension: Pictorial Space in 20th-Century Art* traces this transformation from early modernist works influenced by Cubism through the age of Abstract Expressionism and beyond. Featured artists include Ilya Bolotowsky, Esphyr Slobodkina, and Elaine de Kooning.
